Residual and organic waste (refuse lock)

Polluted: cloths, paper

Nappies, used toiletries

Lightbulbs (except energy saving lightbulbs), music and video cassettes

Toothbrushes, ceramics and porcelain, broken glass, bandaging products

Dust, vacuum bags, ashes, cigarette butts

Flower, bush and tree trimmings, lawn cuttings, foliage

Leftover food, eggshells, tropical fruit peel, vegetables

Single layers of kitchen paper or newspaper

Plant-based bedding for small domestic animals

Hair, feathers, tea leaves, coffee grounds, filter papers

Potted plants (without the plant pot)

















Packaging (Yellow bin or bin bag)

Metal packaging:

Aluminium trays and lids, drink cans, biscuit tins and tin cans

Empty aerosol cans, metal lids and screw caps

Plastic packaging:

Drink bottles, food containers, dairy product packaging

Plastic bags and packaging foil, disposable cutlery and crockery (cardboard plates, plastic knives and forks,

for example)

Composite packaging:

Milk and juice cartons, cardboard packaging with plastic window

Vacuum packaging (e. g. coffee packaging)









Paper / Cardboard (Blue bin)

Books, envelopes, wrapping and packaging paper

Newspapers, booklets, catalogues, paper boxes, cardboard boxes

Brochures, writing paper, corrugated cardboard

Paper or cardboard sales packaging
